

Koi of the Month

Hikarimoyo (He-Car-Ee-Moy-O)

The Japanese translation for hikari is metallic.

These strong looking metallic koi are noted for the color pattern. Many are noted for having a dark line run from their eyes down to their nose.

Five styles that can be seen at Koi Shows would include:

Yamatonishiki (Y'MAT-A-NISH-KEY)

This is a white (platinum) metallic koi that has a red and black pattern. Their scales are metallic sometimes called a metallic



Hariwake (HARRY-WA-KAY)

This is a white (platinum) metallic koi that has a yellowish gold pattern.



Sakura Ogon (SA-KRA-OH-GONE)

This is a white (platinum) metallic koi that has a red metallic pattern.



Kikusui (KEEK-SUI)

This is a white (platinum) metallic koi that has a red pattern. Their scales are metallic sometimes considered a Doitsu version of a Sakura Ogon.




Kujaku (COO-JA-COO)

This is a white (platinum) metallic koi that has a five colored pattern. The colors are white, black, red, yellow, and brown. This metallic fish seems very popular in Japan.
