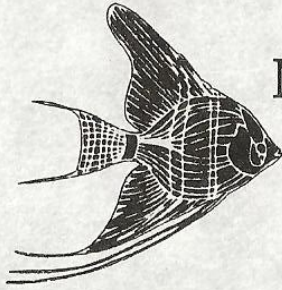
The next board meeting is Wednesday March 27 at the home of Mike Ver-

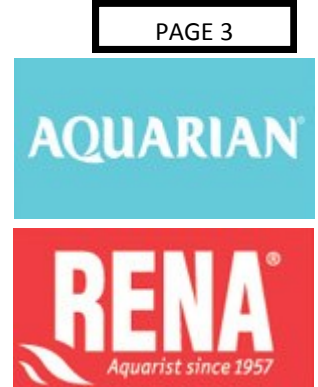
